Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes is the world's Nr.1 region for winter sports. It boasts 175 ski resorts and total c.40 million skier-days a year. More than 90,000 people work in jobs directly related to winter sports here, including over 12,000 ski instructors; they are dedicated to welcome visitors!

Providing wonderfully diverse tourist options, our ski resorts offer a whole range of charming choices, from stations-village (ski resorts based around traditional villages) to high-altitude ski resorts, to destinations particularly suited to families, young people or sporty types.

OUR SKI RESORTS ARE **EASY TO REACH**

A uvergne-Rhône-Alpes, ideally located in the heart of Europe, is served by four international airports (Lyon, Geneva, Chambéry and Grenoble). Daily flights connect these with the world's major capitals and cities. Our ski resorts are then directly accessible via transfer services, buses, taxis or trains; count c.1 hr to 1 hr 30mins from the airports or main train stations.

Over 300 destinations are directly connected with the international airports serving our region. New lines have opened in the course of 2023, including flights from Doha, Bilbao, Florence, Hamburg, Funchal, Birmingham, Liverpool, Cork, Manchester and more.

OLYMPIC AND PARALYMPIC WINTER GAMES 2030

THE OLYMPIC DREAM DRAWS CLOSER!

The French Alps candidate, headed by the regions of Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes and Provence-Alpes-Côte-d'Azur alongside the Comité National Olympique et Sportif français (France's National Olympic Committee), has been selected by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) to enter into "targeted dialogue" for the organizing of the Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games 2030.


The Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes Region, covering the heart of the French Alps, has helped create some of the finest moments in the history of winter sports, having already hosted three editions of the Winter Olympics, including the very first one, in Chamonix in 1924, then those in Grenoble in 1968 and Albertville in 1992.

A new chapter in this history begins this December 2023 – the French Alps, sole candidate invited to enter into targeted dialogue with the IOC with a view to organizing the Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games 2030, is in fact the only candidate put through to the IOC's final selection, before the official attribution of the Olympic Winter Games is announced in summer 2024.

So, the Olympic dream is within our grasp, bringing together all those who love our mountains and all the energy of our regional partners, committed to organizing the most environmentally-friendly winter games, proving responsible and sustainable both in ecological and economic terms.

Of note: 95% of the sites planned for use in the Olympic Winter Games 2030 already exist. Many date back to the 1992 Albertville Winter Olympics. This has proved a major asset for the candidacy of the French Alps, aiming to organize games that set the way for the future, demonstrating how winter sports in the mountains can become increasingly sustainable.

Offering a stunning range of tourist destinations, the ski resorts of the Northern French Alps are recognized worldwide for setting the gold standard in winter sports! In fact, this region has already hosted the Winter Olympics three times, at Chamonix (in 1924), Grenoble (in 1968) and Albertville (in 1992). Plus, the Alpine World Ski Championships were held in Courchevel Méribel in 2023!


The Auvergne region out west boasts five mountain ranges and three ski resorts (Le Lioran, Le Mont-Dore and Super-Besse) as well as extensive areas for Nordic or cross-country skiing. Across the Auvergne, its protected natural areas make it a veritable paradise for those into cross-country skiing or snowshoeing, with over 950km of secure, well-marked trails, across the Aubrac Plateau, the Sancy's slopes, or the Forez Mountains.




A PARADISE for WINTER HOLIDAYS

When the day's forecast indicates snow or rain for more than three hours, customers with this option will be automatically reimbursed, without having to cancel.

First Tracks, to explore Tignes's ski area before anyone else!

Enjoy a unique setting and experience, skiing down Tignes's slopes before anyone else. On this outing, you'll be accompanied by professional ski patrollers as they carry out their early morning duties. Learn about the ski area's secrets and ask the experts your questions. Leave the very first tracks of the day on the freshly groomed pistes as you descend, then enjoy a coffee and croissant together at a café terrace.



Try out ruisseling at Les Contamines-Montjoie

What about exploring one of our mountains from a different angle? To get as close as possible to nature, enjoying splendid, wholly unspoilt scenery in the heart of the Réserve Naturelle Nationale des Contamines (the highest such Reserve in France), try ruisseling. This winter sport, consisting of climbing up frozen streams, is attracting more and more winter sports enthusiasts. Experiencing this activity at Les Contamines-Montjoie brings out strong emotions, as you tackle unique trails that leave quite an impression! The setting is breath-taking, the landscapes untouched, nature at its most invigorating. All told, this is a magical way to enter into close contact with the environment. More than a sport, ruisseling offers an enchanting adventure. You'll be accompanied by experienced local guides who'll teach you how to use the very specific equipment required, including ice axes and crampons. This makes for an extraordinary outing that'll appeal to those who love the mountains, be they simply inquisitive or seasoned explorers.

Snowshoeing and story-telling in the Chartreuse

At nightfall, as nature appears to have fallen asleep, Cyrille invites participants to follow him on an amazing snowshoeing walk under the stars. To immerse you further in the atmosphere, Cyrille recounts mountain stories and fantastical tales as you go along, something that appeals greatly to children, who willingly feel themselves part of the story. After the walk, everyone gathers to enjoy a hearty traditional mountain meal for a lovely end to the evening. It all makes an unforgettable experience for families. www.chartreuse-tourisme.com

Starry snowshoeing & a night in an igloo in the Pays du Mont-Blanc

At Combloux, experience a memorable night out, starting by snowshoeing under the stars (c.1hr 15mins climb, with 230m shift in altitude). Next, tuck into a Savoie fondue, gathered around the pot, in a tepee. Then, fall fast sleep in an igloo (for 2 to 4 people), duvets provided. Next day at 8am, enjoy a convivial breakfast. The igloo village here consists of nine igloos – five igloos for 2 people each and two igloos for 3 / 4 people. Maximum nr of 12 to a group.

Ice floating in Val d'Isère

Try a relaxation pursuit straight out of Finland by going ice floating at the Lac de l'Ouillette with the adventure school, Evolution 2. Dressed in a watertight wetsuit, slip into the icy lake to experience an extraordinary feeling of relaxation. This outdoor flotation allows you to reconnect wholeheartedly with nature, affording a unique feeling of wellbeing. At 2,513m in altitude, in the heart of a ski area, you'll feel like you're floating through the mountain landscapes!



Horse-drawn tobogganing in the Jura Mountains

Your guide, Nicolas Guitton, wears two hats, both rearing horses on a small farm in the Valserine Valley and acting as a trained guide in low-altitude mountains. Year-round, he can put on tours for you to discover the secrets of the Jura Range and its traditional agricultural ways. Nicolas organizes outings that take you as close as possible to nature. Experience intense moments as he leads you out on a horse-drawn toboggan, or on a snowshoeing outing, or then on a hike. He'll guide you through the heart of the Jura Mountains, focusing on specific themes, for instance the making of Bleu de Gex cheese. HIGH TECH ZIPWIRE

First, a bit of history. We're back in the 1930s in Valloire, in July, the hay harvest in full swing. Every evening, barrels full of hay are attached to a cable for them to be sent straight down across the valley to the barns. In Valloire's collective memory, some individuals accidentally got caught on the cables and carried across the valley in rather comically precarious style, thus becoming the first, unintentional practitioners of zipwires! Each hamlet in the Valloire area set up a cable to transport the hav barrels in a much faster, easier way than before, especially as some of their hay was cut at up to 1,800m in altitude. This transport system only worked in the one direction, downwards. At the same time, though, the first cable car for skiers was being

built at Valloire, one of the very first in France, the Téléski de l'Epinette. Now, Valloire is launching the first intelligent zipwire, promising truly extraordinary sensations, with the capability for riders to increase or decrease their speed. In addition, this zipwire can recharge its electric capacity during the descent. Finally, in case of bad gusts, it has all the safety features possible to ensure users don't get stuck midway along the cable. The ride involves a 300m shift in altitude along its 1,380m length, the daring types who try it enjoying stunning 360° views. Combining technological innovation with local mountain traditions, this project creates a nice balance between contemporary and historical cultural practices, as well as taking the environment into consideration.

A contemplative high-altitude mini adventure at Les 2 Alpes

Walking on glaciers is an activity that has traditionally taken place in spring or summer (May to August), but this winter, from March on, local guides will lead walkers out over high-altitude areas, above 3,400m. Glacier hiking takes you close to great summits and aives you a taste of mountain-climbina. You may be walking at exceptional altitude but you'll be accompanied by experts. Step out in your crampons, putting your pick axe to use immediately as you breathe in the invigorating mountain air, enjoying breathtaking views of mountain peaks all around, far from any crowds. This makes for an extraordinary, magical adventure, but it's surprising how accessible it is, with children allowed to take part from 10 years of age upwards.

Rushing down head first at Super-Besse!

Head for Super-Besse in the Sancy Range to try out its Fantasticable giant zipwire, giving you the sensation that you're flying... 45m above the ground, enjoying breath-taking views along the 1,600m (c.1 mile) descent, dropping 250m in altitude. At the start, you get truly impressive views down on the resort. Once comfortably in your harness, you race head first along the wire, reaching up to 120kph! Accessible to over 12s, must weigh over 35 kilos.

OUR MOUNTAINS IN SUMMER a source of WELL-BEING and GOOD HEALTH

From the Alpine lakes at the foot of our mountains to Mont Blanc, the roof of Western Europe, our Alpine ranges offer exhilarating exploring, perhaps on foot or by bike, while you can seek out cooling spots in the heart of nature at our high-altitude lakes, in our Alpine meadows, or in our forests. Our traditional mountain villages are enchanting, with their stone-slate roofs, onion-bulb belfries and baroque churches. By their very essence, our mountains are a source of well-being, for a pampering break, as a place to leave behind modern life, or then to indulge in total relaxation, enjoying unforgettable holidays. The fact that time in the mountains has a beneficia effect on one's health has long been known, now it's been scientifically proven! Then there the endless range of activities now on offer in this immense natural playground...

Aparadise for cyclists (14 major cycle routes; iconic Alpine passes featured on the Tour de France; six major mountainbike trails...), our region is also ideal for keen walkers, with over 33,000km of waymarked trails and such famed hiking paths as the Tour du Mont Blanc, Santiagode-Compostela pilgrimage routes, the Stevenson Trail or the Grande Traversée des Alpes. Down in our Alpine valleys, those keen to try white-water rafting, hydrospeed (riverboarding) or canyoning flock to try such raging torrents as the Giffre or the Arve. The most daring visitors might shoot down a zipwire, say, over the Lac de Hauteville or 100m above the Anse Valley in the Livradois-Forez area, or then jump into the void in the Aravis, dangling from an elastic cord, feeling the full force of gravity. Even more removed from solid ground, paragliders drift skywards on their multicoloured wings above such places as Saint-Hilaire du Touvet and Lac d'Annecy and may be seen brushing past the rounded summits of the Auvergne's great volcanic range, the Chaîne des Puys.

AN UNMATCHED VARIETY OF **MOUNTAIN LANDSCAPES**

From the Northern French Alps, west to the Massif Central mountain chain and north to the Jura Mountains, our region displays an unmatched variety of mountain landscapes. Our Alps are dominated by Mont Blanc (4,809m), but in our world of the gods, as classical authors might put it, our peaks, passes, high pastures and deep valleys extend from the Chablais area to the Beaufortain, from the Tarentaise to the Belledonne, from the Maurienne to l'Oisans. Colossal summits sculpted by time and the elements, from the Aiguille du Midi in the

north to La Meije in the south, incite the bold to conquer them, getting closer to the sun and the eternal snows.

As to protecting the natural environment and our mountains' biodiversity, this major priority has been put into action by the extraordinary number of natural parks created in Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes. Our two national parks, plus our ten regional natural parks scattered right across the region, are helping ensure the preservation of our loweraltitude and high mountain ranges.



Our magnificent mountains, the perfect playground for all the outdoor activities you could dream of.

More than 1,000 lakes are scattered across our mountain ranges. As well as our three great lakes, others that stand out include Lac d'Aiguebelette near Chambéry and Lac de Paladru in Isère, but don't forget our many high-altitude Alpine lakes, or our lakes set in old volcanoes in the Massif Central's eastern foothills, or then the lakes of the Bugey area and the Jura Mountains.

OUR LARGEST ALPINE LAKES FROM THE PUREST TO THE LARGEST!

ac d'Annecy is one of the region's most popular destinations and is considered one of the purest lakes in Europe today. The town of Annecy, nicknamed the Little Venice of the Alps, is crisscrossed by pretty waterways. Beside the waters, historic Annecy boasts splendid streets and arcaded houses, the Alps in the background. Here, visitors often enjoy a cruise with lunch, or as a night-time treat. www.lac-annecy.com

In the 19th century, Lac du Bourget, France's largest and deepest natural lake, inspired the great Romantic Lamartine to pen his poem, "Le Lac", while Queen Victoria counted among prestigious visitors, staying at the thermal spa resort of Aixles-Bains. Today, visitors still appreciate the calming effects of the thermal waters used in treatments, as well as activities on the lake, such as sailing, swimming and angling. www.aixlesbains-rivieradesalpes.com

Lac Léman, better known internationally as Geneva Lake, forms a natural frontier between France and Switzerland. The picturesque old fishing villages as Yvoire, is referred to as another French Riviera. www.thononlesbains.com www.evian-tourisme.com

CHAMONIX MONT-BLANC

This lively mountain town is the gateway to many unmissable sites, such as the Mer de Glace, a alacier reached via the Montenvers rack-and-pinion train, or the Aiguille du Midi and Brévent cable cars, whisking you up close to the very highest peaks in the region. On the Aiguille du Midi's highest terrace, at an altitude of 3,842, step out into the glass box, Le Pas dans le Vide, named the highest tourist attraction in Europe, giving you a uniquely heady experience – below your feet, look down on 1,000m of void; around you, take in views of many of Western Europe's highest peaks. www.chamonix.com

A new cable car of note The new Télécabine du Montenvers at Chamonix Mont-Blanc

Le Montenvers is a tourist spot offering quite unique views down on the Mer de Ġlace glacier and up to the Drus and Grandes Jorasses peaks. It's accessible via rack-and-pinion train leaving from Chamonix, open mainly in summer. This new cable car will make visits to the site much easier, notably ridding tourists of the need to negotiate 530 steps. It should open at the start of this winter season.

At the foot of Mont-Blanc, Chamonix Mont-Blanc is a magnet for mountain-climbers and those into mountain sports.

Aquamotion in Courchevel



EVENTS TO ADD MAGIC TO YOUR HOLIDAYS



The French Alps are renowned for providing visitors with a warm welcome and offering plenty of surprises!

A whole host of events, festivals and exhibitions bring a great atmosphere to our ski resorts throughout the winter. Some highlights: the ice sculptures at the **Concours Inter**national de Sculpture sur Glace de Valloire (9-12 Jan 2024); the Exhibition Chamonix 1924, recalling the creation of the Winter Olympics, at the Maison de la Mémoire et du Patrimoine in Chamonix Mont-Blanc (from Dec 2023); Les Arcs Film Festival, the focus on sustainability with the theme "moving mountains", putting to the fore more environmentally friendly cinema (16-23 Dec 2023); the comedy festival **Les Som**mets du Rire in Arêches-Beaufort, celebrating 20 years; Classicaval, Val d'Isère's iconic classical music festival celebrating its 30th edition (in two parts: 15-18 Jan 2024 and 11-14 Mar 2024).

Pop, rock and electronic music events get our mountains buzzing, notably in spring:

Tomorrowland Winter - for its 4th edition, 16 to 23 Mar 2024, Tomorrowland Winter is back in force, combining skiing and the best of electronic music, to be enjoyed at over 2,000m in altitude. Hundreds of artists will take part across eight stages, from the heart of the ski resort up to the Pic Blanc, at 3,330m.

From 9 to 16 Dec, Rise Festival - on its 9th edition, this event brings together c.6,000 Brits in Les 2 Alpes, enjoying the electronic music and the joys of the ski resort.

Rock the Pistes, across the Portes du Soleil ski area (Chatel, Avoriaz, Morzine) proposes daily live concerts by international artists on the pistes, in mountain settings. Come along from 17 to 24 Mar to experience this unique festival.

The eagerly anticipated La Folie Douce Courchevel Festival will return in April 2024 for a new edition, featuring more music than ever around the ski resort. The eclectic line-up will include concerts and lively DJ sets. Expect to see famous artists giving memorably vibrant performances on the snowline at Courchevel 1850. This event is for everyone, and brings a great atmosphere to the place.

ICONIC **SPORTING EVENTS**

The staging of three Winter Olympics in the French Alps, Chamonix in 1924, Grenoble in 1968 and Albertville in 1992, shows how our region is a great, unmissable outdoor playground for winter sports in general. In addition, our region draws world championship events and other major sporting competitions as well : the Val d'Isère Alpine Ski World Cup events (68th edition this winter of the Critérium de la 1re Neige, 9 & 10 and 16 & 17 Dec 2023); Le Kandahar at Les Houches (3-4 Feb 2024); the Women's Alpine Ski World Cup, returning to Courchevel, featuring a reighting to Coorchever, reading a night-time slalom on 21 Dec 2023; the 2nd edition of the Fis Snowboard Cross World Cup at Les 2 Alpes (1-2 Dec 2023); the Junior Word Ski

Championships at Les Portes du Soleil (27 Jan-3 Feb 2024); and the Bobsleigh World Cup at La Plagne (4-9 Dec 2023).

Crossing spectacular mountain scenery on a truly unique trail, the **Grande Odyssée VVF**, the most important husky sleigh race in the Alps, involves some 400 dogs (13-25 Jan 2024). Also consider the 46th edition of La Foulée Blanche, a cross-country skiing challenge through the Vercors (Jan 2024) and the





Transjurassienne, a cross-country skiing race through the Jura Range (10-11 Feb 2024), plus a special race for keen young cross-country skiers in January.



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
